READER'S THEATER FOR SCHOOL AND LIBRARIES Reader's Theater is a simple, powerful method for connecting kids with books while boost-ing literacy skills Typically, students read aloud from scripts that have been adapted from literature While minimal props can be used, it's the readers' voices that are the heart of the performance

"Fluent readers are able to read orally with speed, accuracy, and proper expression Using content area readings for scripts is a form of curriculum based reader's theatre Curriculum based reader's theatre takes curriculum content and forms it into scripts
